- Conducting a business impact analysis to identify time-sensitive or critical business functions and processes, and the resources that support them.
- Identifying, documenting, and implementing recovery of critical business functions and processes.
- Organizing a business continuity team
- Conducting training for the business continuity team, along with periodic testing and evaluation exercises
